Graduation Immersion for Families

An experience that honors the achievement and supports what comes next.

Graduation marks what your graduate completed. This immersion helps shape and open doors for the nurse they will become through 14 days of international service-learning, nursing education, local leadership and a community of peers.

The experience your graduate is choosing

Prepare with Purpose — Track One combines service with structured NCLEX-RN review before the exam. Step Into What's Next — Track Two combines service with professional-transition learning after the exam. Both include global-health learning and guided reflection. An optional seven-day cultural exploration follows either pathway.

Note: Participants may change tracks at any time before departure.

Support throughout the experience

- Experienced leadership: nursing education led by Jason T. Speaks, PhD, FNP-C, RN, alongside in-country teams and local partners.
- Nurse practitioner accompaniment: accompanied by a U.S.-licensed Nurse Practitioner who is embedded throughout the experience to guide discussion, reflection, and experiential learning in real-world health settings alongside local health professionals—helping participants develop a 360° perspective on global health, professional practice, and culturally responsive care.
- Health-Focused Immersion Standard: All Help2Serve.Care health-focused immersions are accompanied by a U.S.-licensed physician (MD/DO), Physician Assistant (PA), or Nurse Practitioner (NP).
- Practical preparation: pre-departure guidance and orientation, coordinated program transport and lodging, and 24/7 in-country support.
- Defined roles: community service and health education within agreed responsibilities. Clinical activities are observational, with appropriate oversight.



- Travel requirements: participants must carry the required medical and evacuation insurance and follow program conduct and safety policies.

What makes the investment worthwhile

A degree confirms what your graduate completed. This immersion adds documented recognition, perspective and a bridge beyond the classroom through international service. The learning and professional story can continue to inform the first years of nursing and the career that follows.

A decision you can make together

Ask for the exact departure, pathway timetable, total program cost and itemized inclusions before committing. Budget separately for international airfare, required insurance and any applicable entry costs unless explicitly included in a written award. Review the payment, cancellation and transfer terms for that departure.

Choose dates around your graduate's exam plan and employer commitments. A graduation gift should support the graduate's own goals and readiness to travel.

Apply Early. Plan Your Next Step with Clarity.

Qualified applicants who receive official acceptance can begin planning their immersion with documented dates, objectives, anticipated service-learning activities, and expected learning outcomes. Officially accepted participants receive a confirmed pathway, cohort, destination and dates, the applicable syllabus or NCLEX-RN Preparation Map, learning outcomes and immersion objectives, planned service-learning activities with an anticipated hour range, participant scope and role boundaries, predeparture, insurance and safety requirements, and the completion and portfolio requirements.

Official acceptance refers to acceptance into the designated Help2Serve.Care immersion. It does not constitute academic admission, institutional sponsorship, academic credit, clinical-placement approval, employment, licensure, or acceptance into a nurse residency or graduate program.
